




#### What is a P3?

- Public-Private Partnerships (P3s)
  - Contractual agreement between a public agency and a private Developer to Design, Build, Finance, Operate & Maintain a project (DBFOM)
  - Not a sale, lease, or handover to Developer
  - Long term contract with specific and measurable requirements for O&M and end of term handback
  - Greater risk sharing with private sector than design-build (via private capital and O&M scopes)
  - Allows Owner to select proposer based on "best value"; typically a combination of technical and price scores
  - DBF and DBFM may be considered as P3-light




# **Typical DBFOM Transaction Structure**





# Types of DBFOM by Revenue Model

Availability Payment	Revenue Risk
Developer compensation via periodic "availability payments" from Owner	Developer compensation via toll collection
Developer takes risk of Owner failing to make timely payments (low probability)	Developer takes risk of actual traffic & revenue being lower than forecast
Deductions are applied for unavailability and non compliance events	No deductions - revenue model incentivizes Developer to maximize asset performance
Price score driven by lowest AP	Price score driven by lowest public funding need or highest upfront payment to Owner
AP projects not authorized under TX P3 statutes	T&R risk P3s authorized under TX P3 statutes
Lower risk, less complex, more bankable, better financing terms	Higher risk, more complex, higher cost of financing



#### P3 Benefits to Public Sector

- Expedited project delivery leveraging private capital
- Enhanced risk transfer to private sector
- Innovation via Alternative Technical Concept (ATC) process
- Innovative financing solutions
- Project optimization introduces savings and efficiencies upfront capital cost v/s lifecycle/rehabilitation costs
- Conserves public sector debt capacity



### **Key Factors for Success**

- Essentiality of project economic and/or functional necessity
- Political and local support strong advocacy and public outreach
- Clarity of public funding plan define project scope in conjunction with funding plan
- Balanced risk transfer allocation "party best equipped to mitigate and manage each risk"
- Clear pathway to environmental clearances
- Strong/capable owner's advisory team legal, financial, engineering
- Credit quality of the owner critical for AP-based P3s
- Pool of local designers and builders to self-perform



#### **Risk Allocation**

- Risk allocated to the party best equipped to mitigate & manage fundamental tenet of project finance
- Developer mitigates via contractual conveyance, technical solutions, insurance, or contingency
- Certain risks are best shared with or retained by owner e.g. geotech
- Relief events and compensation events provide protection against delays or extra costs not attributable to Developer
- Well crafted risk transfer protocol allows Developer to provide a competitive and efficient proposal
- Wholesale transfer of risk to private sector not conducive to a successful project

### **Financing of P3 Projects**

#### **DBF**

- "Gap" between construction draw schedule and Owner funding plan is financed by the DB Contractor ("gap financing")
  - Not common used by Florida, VA, TX, WV
  - Typically short/medium term financing
  - Sale of receivables with bank/bond debt, repaid directly by Owner

#### **DBFOM**

- Developer arranges long term financing to project capital cost
  - Operating period costs are paid with project cash flow
- Structure varies depending on requirements of the procurement
  - Owner funding levels
  - Cash flow characteristic of the project
  - Lender/rating agency requirements

- Capital structure includes a mix of owner funding, developer equity, and debt (bank loans, bonds, TIFIA). Combined funding sources must cover all costs leading up to Substantial Completion
- Non-D&C work represents 15-20% of total costs
- Capitalized interest is interest paid to lenders during construction when the project is not generating revenue
- Owner funding (Milestone or Final Acceptance Payments) partially offsets need for private financing e.g. FDOT funding for \$2.5 billion I-4 Ultimate project is \$1.7 billion

- SPV costs represent development costs, and G&A during construction
- Reserve accounts are monies set aside to cover financing contingencies; primarily a Debt Service Reserve for the benefit of lenders
- Cash flows from the project (toll revenue or availability payments) will cover operating expenses, debt service, rehabilitation & hand-back, and Developer equity returns post Substantial Completion.



#### **Funding Sources**

#### **Equity**

- Typical equity investors are infra investment funds (Meridiam, Macquarie, Plenary);
   Construction companies (Lane, Walsh, Kiewit) also participate as equity investors
- Developer entity is a newly created SPV (Special Purpose Vehicle) in which equity investors are shareholders
- Equity is more expensive than debt (11-15% vs 3-6%) so maximizing debt is beneficial. Owner specifies minimum equity levels, as do lenders/rating agencies
- Developer earns returns from residual cash flows over the life of the concession

#### **Debt**

- Tax exempt Private Activity Bonds bondholders pay no Federal income tax on interest
  - Limited US Dept. of Treasury program; Owner must apply for allocation
- USDOT TIFIA loans low interest subordinated debt with favorable repayment terms
  - Up to 33% of project cost; dedicated revenue source of repayment e.g. tolls or APs
- Both PABs and TIFIA require an "investment grade" credit rating (min BBB-/Baa3) from a recognized rating agency
- Limited use of bank loans due to (i) shorter tenor, (ii) higher pricing, and (iii) limited availability
   U.S. banks continue to stay away from non-recourse project finance



### **Financing Methodology**

- Starting point is D&C cost, which drives most major development costs
- A financial model reflecting expense and revenue projections for entire concession term (construction + O&M period) is developed
- Includes analysis of accounting and tax assumptions based on specialist advice
- Goal is to raise the required capital at the lowest cost while meeting RFP, lender/rating agency, accounting and tax requirements
  - Mathematical exercise to optimize the structure and develop a competitive proposal

Lender/Rating Agencies Requirements	Other Lender/Rating Agency Considerations
Debt Service Coverage between 1.10x and 1.50x	Contractor experience and financial strength
Debt Service Reserve equal to 6-12 months of interest plus principal payments	Quality of revenue stream – toll/revenue risk or availability payments
Liquid security during construction to cover delays or contractor default; typically an LC between 5-7% of D&C cost	Essentiality of project – indicates likelihood of successful execution by stakeholders
Pay-off window 24-36 months < concession term	Owner commitment and credit rating



# **Challenges to P3s**

- Negative public perceptions
- P3 legislative authority
- Organizational capacity of public agency
- Higher cost of private capital
- Uncertainty in forecast of traffic and revenue
- Competing facility issues
- Toll restrictions on existing interstate routes
- Highly prescriptive technical specifications may inhibit innovation



# **P3 Misconceptions**

Misconception	Reality
Public assets would not be maintained properly by private parties in order to maximize profits	<ul> <li>PPP agreements impose extensive O&amp;M, lifecycle and rehabilitation obligations on the Developer</li> <li>Highly prescriptive performance standards</li> <li>The right to audit/inspect the project facilities</li> <li>Deductions for non-compliance and/or asset unavailability</li> <li>The right to withhold payments</li> <li>Right to step in and operate the project or undertake repairs</li> </ul>
Loss of public control over roadway will result in rapid and uncontrolled toll rate increases	<ul> <li>Tolls/user fees (pay per use) are more equitable than broad based taxes (paid by users and non-users)</li> <li>Federal law prohibits tolling of existing untolled Interstate lanes</li> <li>Contractual arrangements between Developer and owner to share upside</li> <li>P3 agreements may include limitations on toll rate increases</li> <li>Developer bears the risk of high tolls acting as deterrents against roadway usage</li> </ul>



# **P3 Misconceptions**

Misconception	Reality
Private financing makes the project more expensive	<ul> <li>While private financing is generally more expensive, in the absence of public funding, a P3 may be the best alternative to delaying capacity addition or deferring maintenance/rehabilitation expenditure</li> <li>P3 cost includes long term O&amp;M, lifecycle and rehabilitation, which are worth a significant portion of the total cost</li> </ul>
Loss of public assets to foreign companies	<ul> <li>Owner retains asset ownership throughout the contract term</li> <li>several U.S. based firms are active in the P3 market</li> <li>Significant amount of work is still performed by locals</li> </ul>
P3 contract negotiations are too complex and costly to yield a positive outcome	With proper support from experienced advisors and dedicated agency staff, win-win outcomes can be achieved consistently
Private entities make excessive returns on P3s	<ul> <li>Competitive bidding eliminates possibility of excessive returns.</li> <li>Revenue sharing and contract rebalancing provisions</li> </ul>

#### **Example: I-95 Express Lanes, VA**

- \$925M, Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain
  - Conversion of 20 miles of existing reversible HOV lanes to High occupancy Toll (HOT) lanes. HOV-3 free, 76 year concession period. Expansion of existing HOV lanes from two to three lanes for a total of 14 miles
  - 9 mile extension of existing reversible HOV, widening of lanes for BRT and addition of park and ride facilities
  - Fully electronic/dynamic tolling



# **Example: 495 Express Lanes**





#### **Example: 495 Express Lanes**

- \$1.9B, Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain
  - 14-mile segment of beltway, 80-year concession period
  - Two new HOT lanes in each direction with variable tolls, HOV-3 free
  - Congestion-free network for transit service
  - Replacement of \$260 million of aging infrastructure, including more than 50 bridges and overpasses

# **Example: I-4 Ultimate Project, FL**

- \$2.3B, Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain
  - 21-mile segment of I-4, Availability Payment, 40-year concession term
  - Reconstruction of six general use lanes and addition of four new managed lanes
  - Reconstruction of 15 interchanges and 145 bridges
  - Current ADT 140k-250k

- \$2.0B, Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain
  - 21 stations along 16 mile route, 40 year concession term
  - Two new maintenance facilities
  - 1 short tunnel from Wayne avenue to Long Branch
  - Construction 2016-2021





# **External Audit Report**

Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority

TXDOT Compliance Division

#### Objective

To determine if Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority (HCRMA) has effective internal controls in place to ensure TxDOT grant and loan funds are managed in accordance with applicable funding agreements and verify whether costs are allowable and adequately supported.

#### **Overall Conclusion**

HCRMA has implemented effective internal controls and processes to manage TxDOT grant and loan funds in accordance with applicable funding agreements and ensure costs are allowable and adequately supported. All tested expenditure transactions were allowable per applicable agreements.

We identified an instance of non-compliance related to HCRMA's accounting of grant funding. HCRMA's accounting system and requests for reimbursements (RFR) did not separately account for federal and state portions of grant funds expended and reimbursed, as required by 2 CFR 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (2 CFR 200). Management took corrective action to update the accounting system and future RFRs prior to the conclusion of the engagement.

#### Scope

The scope of the audit included HCRMA's current financial, grant and loan management processes and TxDOT funds paid to HCRMA between September 1, 2014 and December 31, 2016. HCRMA received \$3,672,610 in grant reimbursements and \$20,000,000 in State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) loan proceeds during this period.

#### Methodology

The methodology used to complete this audit included:

- Gaining an understanding of HCRMA's operating structure and its financial controls and processes.
- Conducting interviews with HCRMA personnel.
- Conducting interviews with relevant TxDOT Pharr District and Area Office personnel.
- Reviewing TxDOT grant and loan agreements with HCRMA, 2 CFR 200, Texas
  Transportation Code and Texas Administrative Code.
- Reviewing HCRMA's policies, procedures, and relevant agreements with vendors.
- Verifying HCRMA's management of unexpended SIB loan funds in accordance with applicable agreements.
- Verifying completeness and accuracy of a sample of HCRMA's bank reconciliations related to grant and loan funds.
- Comparing approved grant budget to actual reimbursements.

 Comparing expended project funds to project completion timelines for reasonableness.

RFRs and SIB loan expenditures occurring through December 31, 2016 were tested for the following requirements:

- Supporting documentation exists, including proof of payment, and amounts were accurately supported and calculated,
- Costs were allowable and allocable per 2 CFR 200 and TxDOT funding agreements,
- Costs were incurred during the funding agreement period,
- Grant expenditures were paid prior to submission of the reimbursement request, and
- Costs were approved by required stakeholders (i.e., responsible manager, Executive Director, Board of Directors, responsible TxDOT staff).

#### **Data Reliability**

Auditors assessed the reliability of the payment data generated from TxDOT's PeopleSoft Financials accounting system by comparing the data to expenditure and revenue data in the accounting system of HCRMA's fiscal agent. Auditors determined that the payment data was reliable for the purposes of this audit.

#### **Project Information**

This audit was conducted for HCRMA, TxDOT Administration and the Chief Audit and Compliance Officer. The audit was included in the fiscal year 2017 Compliance Division work plan. Audit fieldwork was conducted from January 2017 through February 2017.

We conducted this audit in accordance with Generally Accepted Government Auditing Standards and in conformance with the International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to provide a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives. We believe that the evidence obtained provides a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions on our audit objectives. The audit was performed by Ashlee Jones (Engagement Lead), Gail Ates, Cheryl Durkop, Tasha Foote, and Ruben Juarez.

#### **Background**

Regional Mobility Authorities (RMA) are political subdivisions created by one or more counties and certain municipalities to address regional transportation needs. RMAs may finance, design, construct, operate, and maintain transportation projects. The Texas Legislature authorized RMAs in 2001, and the Texas Transportation Commission (Commission) is tasked with approval of individual RMAs.

HCRMA was authorized by the Commission and the Hidalgo County Commissioners Court in 2005 to accelerate needed transportation projects in Hidalgo County. HCRMA's mission is to provide customers with a rapid and reliable alternative for the safe and efficient movement of people, goods, and services.

HCRMA currently has two active funding agreements with TxDOT. In April 2013, the Commission authorized a \$17,670,000 Advanced Funding Agreement (AFA) for HCRMA to reconstruct and widen US 281 and provide a new grade separated interchange at the SH 365/US 281 intersection. In May 2016, the Commission authorized a \$42,210,000 State Infrastructure Bank Ioan with HCRMA to pay for the costs of right-of-way, utility relocation, and construction of the SH 365 project. The SH 365 project includes three segments of construction of both toll and non-toll improvements. HCRMA received the first of two Ioan disbursements in December 2016 in the amount of \$20,000,000. Additionally, TxDOT has approved \$127,935,862 in future grant funding to HCRMA for construction costs of the SH 365 project.

#### Results

Auditors reviewed HCRMA's internal control structure and processes pertaining to TxDOT funds and found that HCRMA has effective internal controls and processes in place to manage TxDOT funds in accordance with applicable funding agreements and ensure costs are allowable and adequately supported.

HCRMA has experienced personnel in key functions overseeing TxDOT funds, such as construction engineering and record keeping, land acquisitions, accounting, and audit and compliance. The seven member Board of Directors is actively engaged in oversight of HCRMA, and there is a strong review and approval process to ensure costs associated with TxDOT funds are appropriate and allowable. HCRMA has documented policies and procedures governing its processes, including items such as conflicts of interest, ethics and compliance, fraud reporting, and procurement of goods and services. In addition, HCRMA has a positive professional relationship with TxDOT Pharr District and Area personnel that assist in project monitoring and review and approve RFRs. HCRMA received a local construction records audit by the TxDOT Pharr Area Office in October 2016 and took timely action to correct the findings identified.

HCRMA received a total of \$23,672,610 in TxDOT funds between June 2016 and December 31, 2016. The first grant reimbursement for construction of the US 281 Connector project was issued in June 2016, with a total of \$3,672,610 in reimbursements received through December 2016. HCRMA received the first SIB loan instalment of \$20,000,000 for acquisition of right-of-way for segments 1 and 2 of the 365 tollway project in December 2016.

Auditors reviewed all 8 grant reimbursement requests totaling \$3,672,610, and verified all costs were allowable, adequately supported, and received required approvals. However, RFRs and HCRMA's accounting system did not separately account for Federal and State portions of grant funding as required by 2 CFR 200. During the engagement, HCRMA management took corrective actions to update the accounting system and future RFRs to separately account for Federal and State grant expenditures and reimbursements.

Auditors also reviewed SIB loan funds and determined they were appropriately expended and managed. As of December 2016, the unexpended balance of \$14,305,073 was managed and secured by HCRMA in accordance with applicable agreements. Costs incurred as of December 2016, totalling \$5,817,915 were adequately supported, allowable, and received required approvals.

In 2015 RKCl provided truck traffic spectra based on long term traffic projections since the HCRMA wasn't engaged in a T&R update with C&M (the usual traffic projection specialist) at the time and RKCl needed this base data to complete their pavement design and O&M analysis. RKCl proceeded to complete those projections, and finalized their CRCP pavement design and O&M analysis based on those projections which yielded 13.5" thick concrete for the mainlanes and 11.5" for frontage roads for a 30-year pavement design. The engineers proceeded to update the construction plans and estimate quantities with that design, and in December 2016 TxDOT clarified/modified their CRCP standards for 13.5" to require an additional mat of steel (which changed the base standards available at the time which indicated only a single layer might be needed), and industry feedback indicated this could introduce significant cost due to material and installation. Fast forward to beginning of 2017 and due to the fact that are now engaged with C&M to do an investment grade T&R study, we added the task to provide the truck traffic spectra and projections with their more exact modeling. C&M's results show promise that the reduced traffic they projected (which TxDOT SPD and Finance Office have vetted their underlying model) has a strong potential for some reduction in pavement thicknesses which may eliminate the need for the additional steel and may reduce the pavement width yielding overall cost and time savings.

The **AUTHORITY** will provide the following:

- Provide property access as necessary for the Engineer to perform environmental assessment activities described in *Exhibit A*. This is a Professional Services Agreement ("AGREEMENT") entered into by and between the HIDALGO COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("RMA") and THE LAW OFFICES OF DANIEL G. RIOS ("RIOS") and BRACEWELL & GIULIANI LLP ("BRACEWELL," and collectively with RIOS, the "FIRMS"), pursuant to the RMA's authority under the Texas Transportation Code, Chapter 370 ("Regional Mobility Authority Act").

#### Section 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this AGREEMENT is to engage RIOS and BRACEWELL to serve as Co-General Counsel for the RMA.

#### Section 2. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

- 2.01 RIOS and BRACEWELL agree to serve as Co-General Counsel for the RMA and to provide reasonable and necessary legal services when requested by the RMA Board of Directors and/or its Executive Director, if any.
- 2.02 The FIRMS agree to submit a work plan to the RMA to define the distribution of services between RIOS and BRACEWELL and provide for a plan of communication between the FIRMS, the RMA, and the RMA's consultant team.
- 2.03 RIOS and BRACEWELL, as Co-General Counsel agree to work cooperatively and efficiently and to always be conscious of minimizing costs and legal expenses whenever reasonably possible. To this end, the FIRMS agree to use associate attorneys, paralegals, and other lower cost personnel when warranted to save legal costs, but they will always work under the supervision of lead attorneys Daniel Rios and Blakely Fernandez, who will serve as primary counsel to the RMA.
- 2.04 RIOS and FERNANDEZ agree to immediately notify the RMA if any conflict or potential conflict of interest in accordance with the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure may arise after the execution of this AGREEMENT.

#### Section 3. CONSIDERATION

3.01 In consideration of the legal services rendered by the FIRMS as described above, the RMA agrees to pay RIOS and BRACEWELL on an hourly basis for the work and time expended at the rates set forth on Exhibit A. Rates shall not be increased without the prior written consent of the RMA.

- 3.02 The FIRMS shall be entitled to reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses which are reasonable and necessary and incurred incident to the performance of legal services requested hereunder, including sub-contracted services provided by specialized counsel or professionals or other approved services, photocopying, delivery charges, travel expenses, long-distance telephone calls, computer aided legal research applications, facsimile transmissions, and filing fees. The FIRMS agree that they will bill for such out-of-pocket expense at direct cost with no added profit. Any individual out-of-pocket expense exceeding \$1,000.00 must have prior approval of the Executive Director of the RMA in order to be eligible for reimbursement. BRACEWELL is not entitled to reimbursement for long distance phone charges incurred because its offices or attorneys are located outside of Hidalgo County.
- 3.03 Billing statements for legal services rendered, as well as reimbursement requests for out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the FIRMS, shall be independently forwarded for review and approval to the RMA. Thereafter, the approved invoices shall be forwarded for payment to the respective firm within 30 days.

#### **Section 4. INSURANCE**

The FIRMS are each required to maintain professional liability insurance of not less than \$2,000,000. The coverage must extend a minimum of three years beyond the completion of the services.

#### Section 5. TERM

The term of this AGREEMENT is three years, beginning on April 13, 2014, with an option to extend for two one year terms; provided that the FIRMS or the Board of Directors of the RMA may give 10 days' written notice to the other party of termination of the AGREEMENT prior to the end of the term.

#### Section 6. INSPECTION OF BOOKS AND RECORDS

The RMA, or any duly authorized representative of the RMA, may at all reasonable times inspect and examine the books and records of the FIRMS for the purpose of (a) checking the costs and other expenses described and/or contemplated in the AGREEMENT, or (b) otherwise confirming the Firm's compliance with the terms of the AGREEMENT. The FIRMS shall maintain said books and records and other evidence pertaining to costs and shall make such materials available at their respective offices, during the term of the AGREEMENT and for a period of three years after the date of final payment for legal services.

#### Section 7. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

At the conclusion of the FIRMS' services (or earlier, if appropriate), it is the RMA's obligation to advise the FIRMS as to which, if any, of the documents in RIOS' or BRACEWELL's files the RMA wishes returned. The FIRMS may keep copies of all documents. Any remaining documents not requested by the RMA may ultimately be destroyed in accordance with the FIRMS' respective record retention schedule only after reasonable notice to the RMA.

#### **Section 8. ENTIRE AGREEMENT**

This AGREEMENT supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the parties hereto, and no other agreement, statement, or promise which is not contained herein shall be valid or binding.

#### Section 9. ASSIGNMENT

The FIRMS may assign this AGREEMENT or certain duties or obligations hereunder with the written consent of the RMA.

#### Section 10. AMENDMENTS

This AGREEMENT may be amended by the mutual agreement of the parties in writing to be attached to and incorporated into this AGREEMENT.

#### **Section 11. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION**

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this AGREEMENT shall be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions, and this AGREEMENT shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

#### Section 12. ATTORNEY'S FEES

If any action at law or in equity is brought to enforce or interpret the provisions of this AGREEMENT, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees in addition to any other relief to which they may be entitled.

#### Section 13. GOVERNING LAW

The validity of this AGREEMENT and of any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereunder, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas and venue for any disputes arising hereunder shall be in Hidalgo County, Texas.

#### **Section 14. NOTICES**

All notices to either party shall be deemed given when either delivered in person or deposited in the U.S. mail, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the appropriate party as follows:

THIS RESOLUTION is adopted this 28th day of March, 2017, by the Board of Directors of the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority at a regular meeting.

WHEREAS, the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority (the "Authority"), acting through its Board of Directors (the "Board"), is a regional mobility authority created pursuant to Chapter 370, Texas Transportation Code, as amended (the "Act");

WHEREAS, the Authority is authorized by the Act to address mobility issues in and around Hidalgo County;

WHEREAS, the Authority has adopted a Strategic Plan that prioritizes the State Highway 365 (SH 365), International Bridge Trade Corridor (IBTC) and State Highway 68 (SH 68) Projects; and

WHEREAS, on December I 0, 2013, the Authority closed on the Vehicle Registration Fee Revenue and Refunding Bond Series 2013 and has programmed the funds for the advance project development of the SH 365 and IBTC Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Authority solicited Statement of Qualifications for Right of Way Agent Services for the State Highway 365 and International Bridge Trade Corridor Projects; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2013, the Authority received a single response to the request for Statement of Qualifications for Right of Way Agent Services for the State Highway 365 and International Bridge Trade Corridor Project; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2013, the Authority authorized HCRMA staff to negotiate with the single response to the Statement of Qualifications for Right of Way Agent Services; and

WHEREAS, HCRMA staff has negotiated a Professional Service Agreement with AR\WS Texas LP for Right of Way Agent Services, hereto attached as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2014, the Authority awarded a Professional Service Agreement to AR\WS Texas LP for Right of Way Agent Services; and

WHEREAS, the Authority finds it necessary for a contract time extension (March 31, 2017 to December 31, 2018) to the Professional Service Agreement with Sendero Acquisition to provide Right of Way Services for the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority;

      - 1.2.2.6 The Program Manager is to serve as DBE Liaison to the HCRMA RIVV Staff.
    - 1.2.3 File Management
      - 1.2.3.1 Primary project and parcel files will be kept in the <u>HCRMA RIVV Office</u>. Working files will be kept in the Provider's project administrative office, but documents generated or received by the Provider will be forwarded to the <u>HCRMA RIVV Office</u> as they are generated or received by Provider. The format for type of file folders and document order and placement are determined by <u>HCRMA RIVV Staff</u>.
      - 1.2.3.2 Prepare invoices utilizing HCRMA's standard payment submissions forms with supporting documentation. Supporting documentation requirements are determined by HCRMA RIVV Staff.
      - 1.2.3.3 Maintain records of all payments including, but not limited to, warrant number, amount, date paid, etc.
      - 1.2.3.4 Maintain copies of all correspondence and contacts with property owners.
  - 1.3 Title and Closing Services (combined)
    - 1.3.1 Secure preliminary title commitment or preliminary title search, and 5-year sales data from Title Company that will be providing title insurance.
      - 1.3.1.1 HCRMA RIVV Staff has the option to provide the initial title commitment at the beginning of the project and therefore the Provider would not be eligible for the first payment milestone for Title and Closing Services. However, if the Provider has to secure an updated title commitment, the Provider becomes eligible for the first payment milestone for Title and Closing Services.
      - 1.3.1.2 The charges from the Title Company for the preliminary title commitments will be paid by the HCRMA and <u>should not be included</u> in the Provider's negotiated fee schedule.
    - 1.3.2 Secure title commitment updates in accordance with insurance rules and requirements for parcel payment submissions. The charges from the Title Company for the update of the title commitment will be paid by the HCRMA and <u>should not be included</u> in the Provider's negotiated fee schedule.

- 1.2.3 Secure title insurance for all parcels acquired, insuring acceptable title to the HCRMA. Written approval by the HCRMA required for any exception. The charges from the Title Company for the title insurance will be paid by the HCRMA and should not be included in the Provider's negotiated fee schedule.
- 1.2.4 The curative services necessary to provide clear title to the HCRMA is the responsibility of the Provider and <u>is to be included</u> in the negotiated fee schedule for this service. Note: The Provider's <u>curative services do not include costs/expenses</u> that qualify as payment of incidental expenses to transfer real property to the State.
- 1.2.5 The Provider has the responsibility of direct contact with the Title Company to obtain an updated title commitment along with other forms and certified copy of the instrument of conveyance necessary when requesting the Parcel Payment from <a href="HCRMA R/W Staff">HCRMA R/W Staff</a>.
- 1.2.6 The Provider provides closing services in conjunction with the Title Company and will be required to attend closings.
- 1.2.7 Any fee related to obtaining certified court documents and fees for recording same which are not collected at the closing of the parcel shall be direct pass through fees at the exact cost supported by the county court house receipts. No administrative fee, management fee, service fee or profit to the Provider will be paid.
- 1.2.8 Provider shall cause the recordation all original instruments immediately after closing at the respective County Clerk's Office, except for donations which must be forwarded to the HCRMA for acceptance by the Commission prior to recording. The cost of the recording fees and filing fees are paid by HCRMA and should not be included in the Provider's negotiated fee schedule.

#### 1.3 Negotiation Services

- 1.3.1 Analyze preliminary title report to determine potential title problems, propose and inform HCRMA ROW Office of methods to cure title deficiencies. This includes analysis of access easements
- 1.3.2 Analyze appraisal and appraisal review reports and confirm the HCRMA's approved value prior to making offer for each parcel.
- 1.3.3 Prepare and send the letter transmitting the Landowners' **Bill** of Rights by Certified Mail-Return Receipt Requested (CMRRR).
- 1.3.4 Prepare the initial offer letter, memorandum of agreement, instruments of conveyance, and any other documents required or requested by the HCRMA on applicable HCRMA forms.
- 1.3.5 The written offer, appraisal report and required brochures must send to each property owner or the property owner's designated representative through CMRRR. Maintain follow-up contacts and secure the necessary instruments upon acceptance of the offer for the closing. Retain copies of the unsigned CMRRR receipt and the appraisal as support for billing purposes.
- 1.3.6 Respond to property owner inquiries verbally and in writing within two (2) business days.
- 1.3.7 Prepare a separate negotiator contact report for each parcel, per contact
- 1.3.8 All original project and parcel file documents must be kept in the <a href="HCRMA R/W Office">HCRMA R/W Office</a>. All original documents generated or received by the Provider must be delivered to the HCRMA <a href="RIW Office">RIW Office</a> within three (3) working days from the date they are generated or received by the Provider. Copies or working file documents may be kept by the Provider. Maintain parcel files of original documentation related to the purchase of the real property or property interests.
- 1.3.9 Advise property owner of the Administrative Settlement process. Transmit to the <u>HCRMA R/W</u>
  Office any written counter offer from property owners including supporting documentation, and

- Provider recommendation with regard to Administrative Settlements in accordance with HCRMA policy and procedures.
- 1.3.10 Prepare and mail the documents of conveyance by CMRRR, regular mail, email, courier or hand delivery.
- 1.3.11 Appear and provide Expert Witness testimony as a Provider when requested.
- 1.4 Relocation Assistance Services for Residential, Business, Personal Property, Mini Storage Units and Outdoor Advertising Signs
  - 1.4.1 The Relocation Assistance Specialist should provide advance notice of the date and time of their initial meeting with the Displacee with (if applicable and practical) the Appraiser's inspection of the subject property in order to coordinate the appraiser's inspection with (if applicable and practical) the initial interview with the Displacee by the Relocation Assistance Specialist
  - 1.4.2 Notify all Displacees of eligibility for relocation assistance. At the time of initial contact, provide Displacees with a Relocation Assistance Packet consisting of;
    - 1.6.2.1 Page one of the ROW-R-96 form
    - 1.6.2.2 ROW-R-CE form
    - 1.6.2.3 Relocation Assistance Brochure (the HCRMA will provide the Provider with the brochures)
  - 1.4.3 Provide on-going relocation assistance and advisory services to Displacees affected by acquisition of right of way and deliver a completed form ROW-R-96 signed by the Displacee to the <u>HCRMA R/W Relocation Project Manager.</u>
  - 1.4.4 Locate, evaluate, and maintain files on comparable available housing to complete Form ROW-R-106.
  - 1.4.5 Compute and submit the request for relocation housing/rental supplement to the <u>HCRMA R/W Relocation Project Manager</u> on the form ROW-R-107 with supporting form ROW-R-106 with attached photos.
  - 1.4.6 Provide 90-day notice to vacate simultaneous with the delivery of relocation benefits package. The 90-day notice may not be delivered prior to a personal interview with the Displacee to determine the type, needs and eligibilities.
  - 1.4.7 Provide 30-day notice once property has been acquired by the State. Note that the Displacee must be given a total of 90-days' notice.
  - 1.4.8 Notify the <u>HCRMA R/W Relocation Project Manager immediately</u> if the Displacee does not move after 30-day notice expires.
  - 1.4.9 Perform a decent, safe, and sanitary inspection of the replacement housing in accordance with HCRMA policy. Prepare and complete Form ROW-R-116 and submit to the HCRMA RIW Relocation Project Manager.

- 1.4.11 For all Negotiated Self-Moves, the Provider is responsible for requesting moving estimates from moving companies. Moving estimates must be obtained by the Provider and not the Displacee. Moving estimates must be prepared in writing and in the name of the HCRMA and not the Provider.
- 1.4.12 Coordinate and monitor moves with displaced homeowners, business owners, tenants, and with moving companies in accordance with HCRMA procedures.
- 1.4.13 Maintain relocation contact logs on Form ROW-R-96 journaling all attempted and completed contacts with all parties. This includes descriptions of the reasons and outcome for each contact.
- 1.4.14 Attend closings on replacement property if requested by any party involved, and assure supplemental payment is properly distributed.
- 1.4.15 Process and compute increased interest payments as required.
- 1.4.16 Relocation agent will be available for any appeals and hearings.
- 1.4.17 Prepare all relocation payment claim submissions for all Displacees in accordance with HCRMA and HCRMA R/W Relocation Project Manager.
- 1.4.18 Deliver warrants in accordance with HCRMA's guidelines.
- 1.4.19 Provide an executed Form ROW-R-CE (Certification of Eligibility) with all Displacee claims.
- 1.5 Condemnation Support Services (Pre-Hearing Support)
  - 1.5.1 Upon receipt of a copy of the final offer, request an updated title commitment for Eminent Domain from the Title Company.
  - 1.5.2 Prepare, if applicable, Bisection, Drainage Easement, Access Easement, and Temporary Construction Easement clauses for the original set of Legal Descriptions supplied by the HCRMA.
  - 1.5.3 Use the information from the Title Commitment to join all interested parties on HCRMA form ROW-E-49. Spouses of owners must be joined.
  - 1.5.4 Upon completion of the HCRMA form ROW-E-49, prepare a packet containing <u>2 copies</u> each of the following documents: ROW-E-49 form, Commitment, Negotiator's Reports, Appraisal Acknowledgment, Pre-appraisal Contact Sheet, signed and sealed property description, and plat, Final Offer Letter, any correspondence from the land owner or representatives, one original copy of the appraisal report, and any real property records which are relevant to any unusual joiner or service issue. Submit packet to the <u>HCRMA R/W Office</u> for submission to the <u>HCRMA Attorney</u>.
  - 1.5.5 Upon receipt of concurrence for the Appraisal Witness, request the update of appraisal.
  - 1.5.6 Upon receipt of packet prepared by the HCRMA Attorney which will include Petition for Condemnation, Lis Pendens, Order Appointing Commissioners, Order Setting Hearing, Oath of Special Commissioner, and Notice of Hearings, the Acquisition Provider will file the original petition with the County Court at Law or other appropriate Court for a cause number to be assigned.
  - 1.5.7 File the Lis Pendens including the cause number with the County Clerk's Office.
  - 1.5.8 Send a copy of the condemnation petition to the Title Company and request an updated title commitment. The Title Company needs to make sure the appropriate parties were named in the petition and that no changes in title have occurred. The actual cost charged by the Title Company for the title commitment update will be paid by the HCRMA and <u>must not be included</u> in the Providers proposed fee schedule.

- 1.5.9 Upon assignment of a court, file the Order Appointing Commissioners with the judge, retaining a copy of the Order for the files.

- 1.5.16 After the Hearing is set, serve Notices of Hearing to the indicated parties at least twenty (20) days prior to the Special Commissioners Hearing. If it is necessary to join a federal agency, be advised that they have an additional sixty (60) days after service of the Hearing to prepare. The scheduling of the Hearing must allow for this additional time.
- 1.5.17 Once the notices have been served, file the original notices with the court and send copies stamped "copy" to <a href="https://example.copy">HCRMA R/W Office</a> and <a href="https://example.
- 1.5.18 Send a reminder letter 2-3 weeks in advance to the HCRMA Attorney, appraiser, three commissioners, court reporter, and HCRMA R/W Office concerning Hearing dates.
- 1.6 Condemnation Support Services (Post Hearing Support)
  - 1.6.1 For the hearing, prepare Form ROW-E-73 and commissioners time sheets. Submit HCRMA Form ROW-E-73 to HCRMA R/W Office.
  - 1.6.2 Obtain the signatures of commissioners on four (4) duplicate originals of the Award of Commissioners and file one with the court for the judge's signature within 48 hours of the Hearing. Have court clerk file-mark the four duplicate originals and retain three.
  - 1.6.3 Give timesheets to Judge. The Judge determines the amount paid to the Commissioners.
  - 1.6.4 Obtain and distribute 3 signed and file-marked copies of the Award as follows:
    - 1.6.4.1 One file-marked copy to the title company with a request for a commitment.
    - 1.6.4.2 One file-marked copy to the HCRMA Attorney.
    - 1.6.4.3 One file-marked copy (or certified copy) to the <u>HCRMA R!W Office</u> with the previously obtained Commitment to request submission for each commissioner's fee.
  - 1.6.5 Send the Commitment and the file-marked Award to the <u>HCRMA R/W Office</u>. The HCRMA <u>R!W Office</u> will prepare the payment submission for each commissioner's fee.
  - 1.6.6 File state warrant in the registry of the court. File a Notice of Deposit with the court and send certified copies to each defendant notifying them of the date of the deposit. Note The Date of Deposit is the Date of Take.
  - 1.6.7 Take photograph of the interest to be acquired on the day of deposit for relocation verification.
  - 1.6.8 Send written notices of the date of deposit to the <u>HCRMA R/W Office</u> and all interested parties.

1.6.9 Appear as Expert Witness as requested. Sub-Providers must also appear as Expert Witnesses as requested.

#### SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED (by HCRAMA)

- 1. Assurance of ROW Project Release.

RESOLUTION 2017-29 APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER NUMBER 4 WITH FOREMOST PAVING, INC., FOR THE US281/MILITARY HIGHWAY OVERPASS/BSIF CONNECTOR PROJECT.

THIS RESOLUTION is adopted this 28th day of March, 2017 by the Board of Directors of the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority.

WHEREAS, the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority (the "Authority"), acting through its Board of Directors (the "Board"), is a regional mobility authority created pursuant to Chapter 370, Texas Transportation Code, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2005, the Texas Transportation Commission (the "Commission") created the Authority pursuant to (i) the Act; (ii) Title 43, Texas Administrative Code; (iii) a petition of the Hidalgo County Commissioners Court (the "County"); and (iv) findings by the Commission that the creation of the Authority would result in certain direct benefits to the State of Texas (the "State"), local governments, and the traveling public and would improve the State's transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the Act allows the Authority to construct transportation projects within the County; and

WHEREAS, on August 2, 2015, August 9, 2015 and August 16, 2015, the Authority published a solicitation for Contract No. 0220-01-023 for the US 281/BSIF Connector Project, an independent segment of the State Highway 365 Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2015, the Authority opened and read into the record four (4) formal sealed bids for the Project from: (i) Foremost Paving, Inc., (ii) Anderson Columbia Company, Inc., (iii) Texas SAI, and (iv) JD Abrams L.P., ranging in amounts from \$19,425,546.44 to \$22,793,714.80 for construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, Foremost Paving, Inc. provided the lowest Project bid in the amount of \$19.425,546.44; and

WHEREAS, on November 30, 2015, the Authority received written concurrence from the Texas Department of Transportation that Foremost Paving, Inc., is the lowest, responsive and responsible bidder for the Project (the "Concurrence Letter"); and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2015, the Authority approved the contract by and between Foremost Paving Inc. and the Authority for construction of the US 281/Military Highway Overpass/BSIF Connector Project in the amount \$19,425,546.44 in substantially finally form; and

WHEREAS, on April 26<sup>-</sup> 2016 the Authority approved, Change Order Number One (1) to the the contract by and between Foremost Paving Inc. and the Authority for construction of the US 281/Military Highway Overpass/BSIF Connector Project in the amount of \$6,623.32 for a new contract amount of \$19,432,169.76 and addition of three (3) calendar days for total of 538 days.;

WHEREAS, on July 26, 2016 the Authority approved, Change Order Number One (2) to the the contract by and between Foremost Paving Inc. and the Authority for construction of the US 281/Military Highway Overpass/BSIF Connector Project in the amount of -\$279,383.60 for a new contract amount of \$19,152,786.16 and a calendar day total of 538 days.;

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2016 the Authority approved, Change Order Number 3 to the Construction Contract with Foremost Paving, Inc. to adjust plan quantities in the amount of \$39,231.00 for the US 281/Military Highway Overpass/BSIF Connector Project in the best interest of the Authority;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act and the Concurrence Letter, the Board finds that approving Resolution 2017-29, Change Order Number 4 to the Construction Contract with Foremost Paving, Inc. to adjust plan quantities in the amount of (\$42,564.95) for the US 281/Military Highway Overpass/BSIF Connector Project in the best interest of the Authority;

During Phase II Construction, the existing pavement and roadbed will be excavated to a depth of approximately 21 inches below previously constructed Phase I. # **Executive Summary**

**Evaluation and recommendation for Toll Collection System Implementation and Maintenance Services** 

# Objective

Hidalgo County RMA authorized the development of a Request for Proposals (RFP) and evaluation of proposals to select a vendor to provide an Electronic Toll Collection System (ETC). The specific objectives of the procurement were to choose a firm to:

- Design, develop, install, and test an ETC System
- Provide comprehensive maintenance of the ETC System.

# **Evaluation approach**

As explained in documentation leading up to the procurement, evaluation of proposals would be based on the Best Value approach. This evaluation approach seeks to strike the balance between technical and price that will result in the best value to the Authority over the complete term of the contract. Technical aspects encompass many areas such as firm qualifications, experience in projects of similar scope and size, demonstrated ability to meet essential functional and schedule requirements, and the proposed technical solution. The overall cost of the solution is also a key factor.

The evaluation weighting for this procurement, as published in the RFP, is 60% for the technical aspects (including the firm's experience/etc.) and 40% for the cost. This is the norm within the tolling industry. While Fagan Consulting has seen similar procurements where the cost has less weighting (e.g. 35%), it is very rare for a procurement of a tolling system to have more than 40% weight placed on the cost. The Best Value approach seeks to select the best overall firm while guarding against low-bid scenarios for multi-million-dollar revenue systems that will collect millions of dollars over many years. Best Value is the industry standard for selection of Toll System Integrators.

## **Evaluating Technical Proposals**

The highest possible score combining technical and price was 1000. The breakdown of the components follow:

A major factor in objectively evaluating the technical information is the Technical Response Guide (TRG). Seventy-five percent (450 points) of the technical evaluation score is derived from the TRG. The TRG establishes an impartial framework for consensus scoring and justification for all scores. It is the most objective evaluation approach of technical requirements of which we are aware.

The scoring methodology for the TRG follows. Scores other than "2" require written explanation.

3 Points
 2 Points
 Proposal <u>exceeds</u> expectations
 Proposal <u>meets</u> expectations

➤ 1 Point Proposal <u>partially meets</u> expectations

O Points Proposal does not meet expectations, or no information provided

Twenty-five percent (150 points) of the technical evaluation score considered company and personnel qualifications. Again, scores were quantified using a subjective point system. As part of this process Fagan Consulting conducted three reference interviews for each firm and one reference interview for each proposed Project Manager.

The evaluation of these scoring elements requires deliberate effort with maximum attention to detail. The Technical Proposal score is based on the sum of points awarded for the information provided in their Technical Response, plus the Tolling Systems Integrator's (TSI's) Qualifications and References. A maximum of 450 points was possible for the Technical Response and a maximum of 150 points was possible for Qualifications and References, for a combined possible maximum of 600 points.

# **Evaluating Cost Proposals**

Cost proposals were reviewed to assure the prospective TSIs had correctly completed the Price Proposal Form where implementation, hardware, software, and maintenance costs are itemized. The review also provides a measure of assurance that the TSI has made provisions to meet all the requirements stated in the RFP. The Cost Proposal with the lowest value was assigned a score of 400 points.

### **Merging Technical and Cost Scores**

To provide the 60/40 (technical to cost) best value ratio, the proposals have their scores adjusted as shown in the following formulas. The first formula adjusts the best technical score to 600 points, with the remaining proposer's score increased using the same ratio. The second formula adjusts the lowest cost score to 400, with the remaining proposer's score increased using the same ratio.

### Recommendation

TEDSI's recommendation is that HCRMA selects Kapsch as the Best Value Proposer. We recommend ETC as the Second-Best Value Proposer.

# **Key points**

The following are key points noted during the evaluation of which HCRMA should be aware.

Cost

❖ Both cost proposals are within the range expected for a project of this size and scope.

Exceptions noted by proposers

- \* Kapsch listed no exceptions to either the requirements or Sample Agreement.
- ❖ ETC notes 14 exceptions to the Sample Agreement, several of which Fagan Consulting recommends rejecting.
- ❖ ETC lists exceptions that omit, modify requirements, or does not respond to several requirements in their technical response. There are five exceptions in Testing alone.

The exceptions affected scoring only when they affected the technical requirements/response. Sample Agreement exceptions carried no weight and are thus not reflected in the final scoring. Contract negotiations with ETC may prove difficult based on their exceptions.

Change Orders with ETC can be expected based on their exceptions to technical requirements. One of ETC's references noted that "Change Order pricing has increased noticeably with new management." Fagan Consulting cannot accurately estimate the dollar amounts or schedule impacts of change orders at this point in the project.

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2016, the Authority received two responses to its RFP, from Electronic Transactions Consultants ("ETC") and Kapsch TrafficCom Transportation NA., Inc. ("Kapsch") (the "Responses"); and

WHEREAS, Tedsi reviewed the Responses and scored and ranked each proposal as provided in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received the Tedsi recommendation and reviewed the Responses and scoring criteria; and

WHEREAS, the Board shall determine the final ranking of the proposers, select its top ranked firm, and authorize the Authority staff to negotiate and enter into a professional services agreement with the selected firm;

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE HIDALGO COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY THAT:

- Section 1. The recital clauses are incorporated in the text of this Resolution as if fully restated.
- Section 2. The Board hereby determines that the final ranking of the Responses shall be as described in Exhibit B, attached hereto.
